## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- 1. Entries must be presented in complete and safe working order.
- 2. Summer Sounds & Classic Cars Exhibitor tickets include driver plus one passenger any additional passengers would need to purchase a ticket priced at £5 each. You are more than welcome to stay and enjoy the live music well into the evening!
- 3. The Road Traffic Act now applies to all places where the public have access. All vehicles must be insured against third party risks as required by law.
- 4. No driving under the influence of drink or drugs and no unlicensed or under-age driving.
- 5. The organisers (The Hospice of St Francis) reserve the right to ask for proof of insurance.
- 6. No exhibit to be left running without a controller present.
- 7. All vehicles must be safely parked and securely braked.
- 8. A speed limit of 5 m.p.h. shall apply to all vehicles.
- 9. Exhibitors must pay proper regards to the Hospice Marshals instructions and conduct themselves in a manner which will not inconvenience other persons at the event site. The organisers reserve the right to ask persons to leave the event site in the event of serious breaches of the regulations, misconduct, or for any other reason which may be pertinent to the good running of the Show or the enjoyment of others attending.
- 10. The organisers reserve the right to restrict entries if needed. Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis.

- 11. Vehicles without a Show Entry Number on display on the wind screen will be treated as late entries.
- 12. No unauthorised trading or any kind from vehicles on the event site.
- 13.For H&S reasons, any vehicles wishing to leave before 4:00 pm must park in the public parking, outside the show area.
- 14. An area will be reserved for trailers and their tender vehicles. Please unload your exhibit vehicle in this area and not on the event site where cars are to be displayed.
- 15. Postal Entries Please ensure you include a stamped and addressed envelope A5 –
  9" x 4". Please do not send very small envelopes as these make enclosure of paperwork difficult.
